

Letter From Aida H. Ingraham

Dear Sir:

The inclosed Personal Affairs Statement is forwarded at the request of the person whose signature appears thereon. This is sent for your information and to acquaint you with what has been done in connection with insurance, records, allotments, and legal matters of the individual concerned.

If the emergency addressee should change his address, while the serviceman is stationed outside the continental limits of the United States, it is requested that The Adjutant General, Washington, 25, D.C., be informed, by you, of such change in the address of the emergency addressee.

It is desired that beneficiaries of Army Air Forces personnel be advised that it is not necessary for them to pay a fee to any firm or individual in order to obtain payment of monetary benefits to which they are entitled. They should further be advised that Army Air Forces Personal Affairs officers are fully prepared and competent to assist them in the proper execution of applications for pensions or other benefits.

It is suggested that the inclosed statement be kept in a safe place so that it will be available as a ready reference in case a need arises.
