Since then I have been out in Utah and Idaho the most of the time, and have not heard a word as to what you had done in the way of closing up the matter. Please let me know just what you have done in the matter.

Mrs. Matthews has been in Chicago all summer. She and her niece, Mrs. Eva Wheeler will start for a trip in Ohio next Monday. They will visit in Hubbard.
